General Requirements

Early College is the enrollment of an eligible secondary student or home education student in a postsecondary course creditable toward high school completion and a career certificate or an

College program. Students must enroll in courses at SCF that are creditable toward a degree or

student's GPA and will appear on their college transcript.

2. All grades, including "W" for withdrawal, become a part of the student's permanent college transcript and may affect subsequent postsecondary admission.
3. While appropriate for college-level study, course materials and class discussions may reflect a broad range of topics not typically included in secondary courses. Courses will not be modified to accommodate variations in student age and/or maturity. The

decision to participate in a course cannot be amended after the normal drop add period based on the nature of content being covered in the course.

Home Education Program Official's Responsibilities

- Before enrolling in the Dual Enrollment program, parents and students are encouraged to discuss the student's academic and career goals and how those goals affect the classes the student takes at SCF.

It is the Home Education Official's responsibility to ensure that the student is

in compliance with the county in reference to his/her home education curriculum.

- It is the Home Education Official's responsibility to ensure classes taken are needed for high school completion or Florida Bright Futures eligibility. The Home Education Program Official should work directly with the county office and Bright Futures to determine the student's eligibility.
